Lots of Dots One-to-One Correspondence More or Less









What You Need:

- Sticky Color Coding Labels Removable Small Circle Dot Stickers for Classroom Organization Decorations Yard Sale Calendar Planner, 3/4 inch Diameter, 12 Colors, Total 1680 Dots in 24 Sheets (Amazon for \$9.99).
- Tile floor, knobs on cabinets, windowpanes, etc.

What You Do:

1. Model this activity. Put one dot in each square tile on your kitchen floor or on each knob on your cabinets, etc.

Variation:

- 1. Let your child put one dot on each day of an old calendar. Each morning put one dot on that day. You can combine this activity with teaching the days of the week. "Today is Tuesday, let's put one dot on Tuesday." Song to tune of "Oh My Darling Clementine" (Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday).
- 2. Use counting chips. Put one dot on each chip.
- 3. Recycle yogurt containers, the tops of bottles, lids of cans, etc. Put one dot on the bottom or top of each container/lid.
